

# Overview of Groove Pages


In the following pages, you can find a screenshot and brief description of the pieces you can use and will use to build your Groove Pages. It is not meant to be a complete list of every function, but rather, a simple description to help you have a bigger picture of how pages are built within Groove.






FIRST - A couple of warnings before you begin building.

AT THIS POINT, NEVER use the little options below the text. Instead, learn to use the features that are on the right when a text element is selected. This is because the controls to the right are much safer for a responsive site.












AT THIS POINT, NEVER use the "Drag and Drop" option when moving or resizing any element. Again, instead, learn to use the options for each of these on the controls listed to the right when an element is selected. (We will go over this in the Build Challenge.











#### BASIC STRUCTURE UNDERSTANDING:


There are three main principles to understand when using Groove. These three will be your basis for ongoing success when using Groove Pages.

The three are:

- 1. BLOCKS
- 2. CONTAINERS
- 3. ELEMENTS

If you start with this mindset, you will be WAY ahead of the game. Here goes:

## **ELEMENTS** go in CONTAINERS that go in Other CONTAINERS or BLOCKS





This will be important for spacing, centering, adding an element and putting it where you want it to be. We will explore this more in the FUNNEL CHALLENGE.



Think of BLOCKS as a small grouping of elements for people to see. Many times, these are very similar in size so that as a person scrolls through your page there is a similarity to the feel.


So, here are some examples of BLOCKS that are ready made for you to put onto your page:


















































Once BLOCKS are added to your page, you can add the elements you want to have on the block. (If you used one of the reformatted blocks, and I highly recommend that when building your first funnel, you will already have it populated with containers and elements. Following are some examples of ELEMENTS (of which CONTAINERS are a subset - I'll explain in the Challenge)












### A FEW TIPS ABOUT PAGES within a SITE

In any funnel/site, you can have unlimited number of pages. Pages are created and managed by a control bar on the LEFT side of your site. We will talk more about all of the pages settings available in the CHALLENGE.






Each Page has it's own settings which can be changed to perfect the site's functions.
